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What is Discipleship?

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Discipleship is teaching biblical precepts, while modeling and guiding others toward living righteously as followers of Jesus Christ. This should be a cyclical process—meaning once we are discipled, we are to disciple others, and so on. One of the most important characteristics of being a disciple (a

state pupil), is to develop an intimate relationship with God through Christ rather than just bout Him. Discipleship equips the Christian with God's Word, prayer, doctrine, worship, encouragement, and service.

Numbers 27:18 - 20 And the LORD said to Moses: "Take Joshua the son of Nun with you, a man in whom is the Spirit, and lay your hand on him; ¹⁹ "set him before Eleazar the priest and before all the congregation, and inaugurate him in their sight. ²⁰ "And you shall give some of your authority to him, that all the congregation of the children of Israel may be obedient..

"The next ceremony, adopted shortly after the others, was the imposition of hands, which, it is known, was the usage of the Jews at the ordination of a rabbi."



It is believed that Hashem taught the Torah to Moshe Rabbeinu on Mt. Sinai in 1312 BCE and that since that time, the knowledge of Torah has been passed from generation to generation by the conferment of semikhah, rabbinic ordination, or the unbroken transmission of authority dating back to the time of Moshe. This unbroken chain of tradition is believed by many to have continued for over 3,300 years and continues to this day

Becoming a Disciple

- × age 5 all children attend the Beit Sefer (house of the Book)
 - + Associated with a synagogue
 - + Taught by a rabbi (teacher, school-master)
 - + Instructed in the Torah (reading, writing, memorization)
- * age 12 or 13 primary education is complete
 - + Children learn to be adults
 - × Boys learn the family trade, participate in first Passover sacrifice
 - × Girls learn to be a homemaker
 - + Beit Midrash (House of Study) for boys with exceptional study skills
 × More memorization, study prophets and writings

Becoming a Disciple

- age 18 marriage was encouraged, but some 'gifted' boys were allowed to continue studies under a rabbi
 - + Become a 'talmad' (a disciple)
 - + Search for a rabbi with -
 - × a good reputation
 - × a good understanding of scripture
 - <u>Ask</u> to join his disciples (Heb. talmadim)
 - × Many were rejected
