Context implies -

- The mind of God . . . what He thinks and what He is doing
- The culture of the people
- The purpose of the text surrounding the scripture

- Jacob stole the blessing from Esau

From the context we find –

- Jacob = 'heal catcher' (Gen 25:26)
- Esau <u>sold</u> the birthright for a bowl of soup (Gen. 25:31-33)
- God had always intended for Jacob to have the birthright (Gen. 25:23; 28:3-4)

God's Mind on the Matter

The Offering of the Firstborn



^{NKJ} **Exodus 7:4-5** "But Pharaoh will not heed you, so that I may lay My hand on Egypt and bring My armies *and* My people, the children of Israel, out of the land of Egypt by great judgments.⁵ "And the Egyptians shall know that I *am* the LORD, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and bring out the children of Israel from among them."

NKJ Exodus 12:3-6 "Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying: 'On the tenth *day* of this month every man shall take for himself a lamb, according to the house of *his* father, a lamb for a household ... ⁵ 'Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year ... ⁶ 'Now you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month. Then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it at twilight.
